 kins and Gramberry Islands and a number of other Islands. I am gentlemen

The last lines of the French ^{grant} are as follows, first we begin at a stake of stones near
 the Old Mill dam on the Eastern side of Shelling's river called Swedenland
 side from P. Stake and stones we run first North five hundred fifty two rods to
 Canton bay then we cross a cove in P. Bay four hundred thirty two rods the
 same course then from P. Bay we run four hundred sixty rods due North to a
 line soe marked for North East corner of P. Grant, then we run due west seven
 miles and fifty six rods to Union River, then we run the same course on the West
 side of Union River two miles one hundred seventy two rods to a stake of stones
 from thence we run South Sixty east to Union, then we cross P. River on the
 same course one hundred seventy six rods to a stake and stones that stands
 in Adalajah Jordans fields, from thence we run South 10th west to Union river
 from thence following the shore to the first mentioned bound, these lines are
 taken by me, agreeable to the Instructions I have received from Nathan Jones
 Esq: and General Samuel Thompson who personally attended in drawing the
 same in behalf of the Commonwealth. -
